TOWN OF ORLEANS

LOCAL LAW NO. ____ FOR 2019

A LOCAL LAW TO OVERRIDE THE TAX LEVY LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW §3-c

BE IT ENACTED by the Town Board of the Town of Orleans as follows:

- Section 1. Legislative Intent: It is the intent of this local law to override the limit on the amount of real property taxes that may be levied by the Town of Orleans pursuant to General Municipal Law §3-c, and to allow the Town of Orleans to adopt a budget for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2020 and ending December 31, 2020 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law §3-c.
- Section 2. Authority: This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of the General Municipal Law §3-c, which expressly authorizes the Town Board to override the tax limit by adoption of a local law approved by a vote of at least sixty percent (60%) of the Town Board.
- Section 3. Tax Levy Limit Override: The Town Board of the Town of Orleans, County of Jefferson is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year 2020 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law §3-c.
- Section 4. Severability: If any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or the application thereof to any person, individual, firm or corporation, or circumstance, shall be adjudicated by any court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid or unconstitutional, such order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder thereof, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this Local Law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.
- <u>Section 5.</u> Effective Date: This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

- 10. Rob Campany update- Collins Landing sewer update- moving along will be needing revised easements for water & sewer. District is officially formed. 3 application for funding have been submitted. Should here from 1 funding agency by December. Working with DEC on their easement.
- Rte. 12 Water- Rob gave update on project. TI Park Rob has received many phone calls from TI Park Corp wanting to know what we are going to do this fall. Rob thinks the DPW and him need to get together and discuss plans.

Jim Burrows gave a few Collins Landing West easements for water to Tammy so Dale & Tammy can get these easements signed. Jim also mailed some easements.

- 12. Other-Manny Jerome stated that there is a lot of crakes on County Route 100. He will call Jim Lawrence from the county to let know.
