WHEREAS, to aid the Town Board in its determination as to whether the proposed Ordinance will have a significant effect on the environment, Part I of a Short Environmental Assessment Form has been prepared, a copy of which is on file with the Town Clerk.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, by the Town Board of the Town of Orleans, New York that

1. Based upon its examination of the Short Environmental Assessment Form and comparison of the proposed action with the criteria set forth at 6 N.Y.C.R.R. §317.6, .7 and .11, no significant impact on the environment is known and the adoption of the Amendment to the Zoning Ordinance will not have a significant effect on the environment.



- The reviewer is not expected to be an expert in environmental analysis.
- If you are not sure or undecided about the size of an impact, it may help to review the sub-questions for the general question and consult the workbook.

- Consider the possibility for long-term and cumulative impacts as well as direct impacts.


