Dear Mr. Rarick,

Thank you for the opportunity to share my thoughts and concerns today in this Public Hearing on the topic of New York State's legalization of cannabis dispensaries and on-site consumption establishments.

This letter supplements the concerns submitted in my September 9, 2021 letter addressed to you that was shared with the Town of Orleans Board. Briefly some of the comments and concerns from my previous letter include, but are not limited to the fact that other neighboring communities are choosing to take a watch and wait approach by opting out of the cannabis law and waiting for definitive regulations to be developed, health concerns of recreational cannabis use, effects of cannabis impairment in the workplace, the unavailability of proper screening tools for driving under the influence, cannabis cash business in our communities with regard to safety of its citizens, and the impacts of drug use and abuse in our North Country communities to name several of the topics discussed in the letter.

While the Marijuana Regulation and Taxation Act, or MRTA, that was passed on March 31, 2021, establishes the framework for a rotating board and the agency it will oversee: the Office of Cannabis Management (OCM), at this time there are still very few rules of engagement and regulations for the Adult-Use

Cannabis Industry. The state Cannabis Advisory Board will consist of thirteen members, and additionally will also include the Commissioners of the Department of Environmental Conservation, Department of Health, Department of Labor, Department of Agriculture and Markets, Department of Education, Office of Children and Family Services, Division of Housing and Community Renewal, and OASIS, as non-voting ex-officio members. This Cannabis Advisory Board has not been appointed yet, as of today. The five individuals for the Cannabis Control Board were just appointed a few weeks ago and they are just beginning their work in creating the regulations for each of the cannabis programs, while the OCM will be responsible for implementing these regulations. The Cannabis Advisory Board, once appointed, is within the OCM and directed to work in collaboration with the Cannabis Control Board and the Executive Director to advise and issue recommendations on the use of cannabis.

The rules and regulations regarding dispensaries and many other aspects of the cannabis business are not yet established. The Control Board will be drafting more rules in the months to come, but it is unclear when this information and guidance on dispensaries will be public.

By the Town of Orleans Board choosing not to make a decision to opt out prior to the December 31, 2021 deadline, in essence, the Town is choosing to opt in before regulations have been drafted. Once the Town opts in by not opting out, there is no option to back away from this commitment.

However, if the Town of Orleans chooses to step back, watch and wait, by opting out now, thereby allowing for the Cannabis Advisory Committee to be selected, for the Cannabis Control Board to establish the regulations that would guide the sale of cannabis at dispensaries and for on-site consumption, then there will be an opportunity at a later date to review the regulations, the information set forth, and data, and an educated decision can be made in the best interest of the Town of Orleans community.

I implore you, Mr. Rarick, and this Town of Orleans Board, to step back, OPT OUT now, wait for the Regulations to be promulgated and then examine whether this complements and fits our Town of Orleans community.

I want to ask how many of you would be willing to sign this contract that I have here with me. There are no details available for this binding agreement, but I will add them in after you sign the contract and once I know what I want to put in the contract. That is basically what the Town of Orleans would be doing by NOT choosing to OPT OUT.

Please, I ask you to do what is right for the Town of Orleans community given the lack of information in the binding contract set before you by the Cannabis Law.

WHEREAS, Town of Orleans was notified by letter by NYS DEC & NYS EFC that disinfection to the wastewater treatment process is required in accordance with 6 NYCRR Part 703.4. and modifications to the State Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (SPDES) permit.; and

WHEREAS, the Town is progressing with the project to upgrade its wastewater treatment process to include Ultraviolet (UV) Disinfection to the LaFargeville STP UV Improvements (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Project is a Type 1 Action pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act and the regulations promulgated therewith ("SEQR") but the Town Board has elected to conduct a Coordinated Review; and

WHEREAS, the engineer for the Town has prepared and submitted to the Town Board a Long Form EAF relative to such improvements to the STP UV Disinfection and

WHEREAS, at regular meeting of this Board held on October 14, 2021, Part I of the Long Form EAF was duly accepted for filling by this Board, this Board declared itself lead agency for the SEQR review, and directed the engineer for the Town to circulate that notice together with Part I of the EAF to the other involved agencies; and

WHEREAS, by letters dated October 20, 2021, Part I of the EAF was forwarded to each of the other involved agencies this Board has either received the consent of the other involved agencies to serve as lead agency, or more than thirty (30) days have elapsed; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 6 NYCRR part 617, this Board has reviewed Part II of the Long Form EAF to determine whether the STP UV Disinfection Project will have a significant effect on the environment; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article VIII of the Environmental Conservation Law and the regulations adopted pursuant thereto by the Department of Environmental Conservation, to wit: 6 NYCRR Part 617, this Board has determined that the Action will not have a significant effect on the environment and will not cause a significant impact on the environment, and therefore, the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement is not required.

NOW, THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Town Board of the Town of Orleans as follows:

- Based upon the examination of the Long Form EAF and the criteria set forth in 6 NYCRR Part 617, this Board makes the following findings.
 - The foregoing recitations are incorporated herein and made part hereof as if fully set forth hereafter.
 - b) The proposed Action constitutes a Type 1 Action pursuant to 6 NYCRR Part 617 and this Board has conducted a coordinated review.
 - No potentially significant adverse impacts on the environment are noted on the EAF and none are known to this Board.
 - d) There will be no substantial adverse change in existing air or water quality.
 - e) There will be no hazard to human health.
 - f) There will be no substantial change in the use or the intensity of use on the land.
 - g) There will not be created a material conflict with the community's current plans or goals as officially adopted. None of the criteria listed in 6 NYCRR section 617.11 will be present in the proposed Inspection and no similar criteria will be present which will adversely impact on the environment.
- 2. The notice of Determination of No significance attached hereto is hereby adopted and accepted by this Board as its Negative Declaration in connection with this inspection.
- The Town Clerk for the Town of Orleans is hereby directed to file in the Town Clerk's office
 in the file readily accessible to the public the Negative Declaration attached hereto and
 forward a copy of the Negative Declaration to the other involved agencies.
- 4. All subsequent notices concerning this inspection shall note that this Board has issued a negative declaration.


