RESOLUTION 9 ISSUING TOWN BOARD'S DETERMINATION AND FINDINGS IN CONNECTION WITH EXERCISE OF EMINENT DOMAIN TO ACQUIRE EASEMENTS IN REAL PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the Town Board for the Town of Orleans, New York previously formed NYS Route 12 Water District a/k/a Orleans Water District No. 2 associated with a Water Distribution Project that will serve several hundred residents in the NYS Route 12 corridor from the Route 81 interchange to the Town of Clayton line; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Orleans previously acquired easements upon and across approximately 200 critical parcels within the District that would include a Water Main vital for the provision of public water to all affected properties in the District; and

WHEREAS, eight (8) parcelsremain classified as "critical" in that those parcels would also include a Water Main vital for the provision of public water to all affected properties in the District and the Record owners of those same eight (8) parcels have not yet provided the necessary easement to the Town of Orleans to enable the Water Project to continue; and

WHEREAS, The Town Board believes that it is in the best interests of the citizens of the Town of Orleans to continue its efforts to provide abundant potable water to its residents in the District; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing pursuant to Article 2 of the Eminent Domain Procedure Law was conducted on Monday, November 27, 2017 for the purpose of informing the public, reviewing the public use to be served by the proposed project, and acquisition of easements necessary to enable the project to continue; and

WHEREAS, public comments were made in connection with the proposed project; and

WHEREAS, the following property owners expressed support for the project, but voiced concerns with their respective easements:

 $\mbox{WHEREAS},$ the Town of Orleans has considered its record and input from all interested parties; and

WHEREAS, Article 2 of the Eminent Domain Procedure Law requires that within ninety (90) days after conclusion of the public hearing held pursuant to Article 2 of the Eminent Domain Procedure Law the Town Board must make a Determination and Findings concerning the proposed project and must publish a brief synopsis of its Determination and Findings in at least two (2) successive issues of its official newspaper;

WHEREAS, the Town Board has concluded its environmental review pursuant to SEQR and has issued a negative declaration.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Orleans Determination and Findings concerning the proposed project is attached as **Exhibit A** and is hereby incorporated for reference; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk of the Town of Orleans shall cause a brief synopsis of the Town Board's Determination and Findings concerning the proposed project to be published in two (2) successive issues of the Watertown Daily Times forthwith which synopsis should also state that copies of the Determination and Findings will be forwarded upon request and without cost to interested parties; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town Clerk and/or her designee shall serve by personal service or certified mail, return receipt requested, a notice of a brief synopsis upon the record owners of each of the eight (8) remaining critical parcels, together with a full and complete copy of this Resolution of Determination and Findings with Notice that pursuant to EDPL §207 stating that there are 30 days from completion of final publication of the brief synopsis to seek judicial review of the Determination and Findings; and in accordance with EDPL §207 and §208, venue for any judicial review of the Determination and Findings is in the Appellate Division, Fourth Department; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall take effect immediately.
